- 5. Will I feel safe in this community at a time of increased personal or national need?
- 6. Does the campus culture fit with my personal values while also encouraging me to explore new ideas and interact with a wide range of people?
- 7. Am I ready to make a personal commitment to challenge myself and make the most of my opportunities at this college?

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
